# PARENT ENGAGEMENT MATTERS

TORONTO CATHOLIC SCHOOL BY-LAWS (TCDSB) CATHOLIC SCHOOL PARENT COUNCIL (CSPC) BY-LAWS

#### TCDSB, CSPC BY-LAWS

All elementary and secondary schools within the Toronto Catholic District School Board (TCDSB) must have current local CSPC By-Laws to govern the conduct of all Council activities. Without exception, all Councils, in all TCDSB schools, must use the mandated TCDSB, CSPC By-Laws (Policy S.10, Appendix A) that are written in accordance with Ontario Ministry Regulation 612/00, Policy S.10, and correlated TCDSB policies and procedures.

Provided that they follow Regulation 612/00 and TCDSB policies and procedures, the only changes that a local CSPC can make to the standard TCDSB, CSPC By-Laws are seven (7), and they are as follows:

- the number of times that a newly elected member can consecutively hold the office of chair
- the number of times that the full Council shall meet; however, in all cases, The Council shall meet no less than 4 times annually, including the Annual General Meeting (AGM)
- the number of elected parents iii.
- the number of community representatives iv.
- the number of meetings that a member can miss v.
- amendments and/or additions to standing committees vi.
- responsibilities of chairs of any sub-committees

#### ANNUAL REVIEW OF CSPC BY-LAWS

Each school's CSPC's by-laws must be distributed and verified each year at the AGM by the school parent community.

To prepare for the annual review, the elected Council must appoint members to the school's By-Laws Standing Committee at the Inaugural meeting. The committee will then be responsible for reviewing the current 7 amendments throughout the academic year, and for presenting the revisions, if any, at a regular CSPC meeting. At this meeting, The Council, will vote to accept, or change, the recommendations made by the By-Laws Standing Committee, prior to presenting the by-laws at the AGM.

### Composition of the School's By-Laws Standing Committee

- Members of the standing committee may be recruited and appointed by the committee chair
- Any parent/guardian with a child registered at the school can be a member of the committee
- The committee must have at least one parent member who was elected to The Council
- The chair/co-chairs of The Council and the principal are ex officio members of the committee

#### ANNUAL REVISION PROCESS OF CSPC BY-LAWS

1. CSPC establishes a by-laws standing committee to review the current local 7 amendments made to the TCDSB, CSPC By-Laws

2. The 7 amendments are presented at a scheduled CSPC meeting (May/June), and voted on by The Council

> 3. Proposed amendments are placed as an agenda item, 20 school days before the AGM

4. Proposed amendments, or by-laws, are distributed to the parent school community, at least ten (10) days before the

5. Proposed amendments, or by-laws, are presented at the AGM for a ratification vote by the full parent body

## MOST FRENQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- 1. Can CSPC devise local by-laws adopting only some sections of the TCDSB, CSPC By-Laws?
  - No. The mandated template must be adopted as is. The only changes that can be made are the 7 local amendments.
- If no changes are suggested to the existing amendments, do the by-laws still have to be presented and verified at the AGM?
  - Yes. This is a yearly process to ensure that the voice of all parents, including new parents to the school, is included.
- Does the CSPC chair have to be Roman Catholic?
  - Yes. (Policy S.10, Reg, 1, ii). If the elected parent who is running for chair is not Catholic, The Council can opt to have Co-Chairs, one being Catholic.
- 4. If re-elected as a parent representative, what is the max number of years that a parent can serve as chair?
  - This amendment was added to the by-laws not to provide a maximum, but rather a minimum to ensure equity of opportunity for all parents, versus the same parent consecutively running for over 2 consecutive years).
- 5. Can the position of the community member on CSPC be filled by a parent who wants to serve on The Council but was not elected as a parent representative?
  - No. This position is an opportunity for an external member who can be the voice of, and can represent, the neighboring school community on The Council.
- Do all parents need to be sent a copy of the ratified and current by-laws?
  - Yes. All parents must have access to the school's CSPC By-Laws. It is a good practice for schools to post them on the TCDSB school's webpage.
